How to Defeat Sin — Part 2 Overview:

Two Brothers - Cain & Abel (& Seth)

Two Offerings - Farmer & Shepherd/Cereal & Lamb

Cain - A grain/fruit (Cereal) offering

Genesis 4:2 "Cain brought to the LORD an offering of the fruit of the ground..."

Abel - A sacrificed lamb offering

Genesis 4:3 "Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions..."

Two Attitudes - Pride or Humility

• A prideful (more vulnerable to sin) attitude:

<u>Deuteronomy 12:8; Judges 17:6</u> & <u>21:25</u>

Judges 17:6 "Everyone did what was right in their own eyes."

• A Humble (more able to defeat sin) attitude:

Two Choices - Good or Bad (*Tov* or *Ra*/Right or Wrong/Life or Death)

Two Seeds - Woman & Serpent

Genesis 3:15 "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Last week we looked at what SIN is and 4 things that SIN does, to make us vulnerable.

Sin is:

Missing or falling short of the target or goal - to love, prioritize and trust God and to love & care for others (**Deuteronomy 6:4-9** & **Matthew 22:36-40**).

Sin does:

- It Lies in wait
- It Lures us off course
- It Listens not to correction
- It Leads our lineage astray

The most important thing we can do to defeat sin (Our Part):

- Accept Jesus
- Believe (Trust) in Jesus
- Confess to Jesus

Three things about sin:

- 1. Jesus, on the cross, died once to pay for the penalty of sin. (God's Part)
- 2. We must take up our cross daily & die to the power of sin. (Our Part)
- 3. We will one day die & be free from the presence of sin.

Back to our story:

I. Four things we can be Aware of, and do, to Defeat (Die to the power of) Sin

The path to spiritual growth comes through the door of awareness.

The path to defeat sin comes through the door of awareness.

Awareness is the process of some truth about God (and His purposes) or ourselves (who we are) coming to light. It is seeing what was previously unseen, understanding what was previously not understood, knowing what was previously unknown.

Antonyms for Awareness: Ignorance at best, Denial at worst

Awareness of sin can empower us to Recognize that in our vulnerability, sin can be:

1. Activated by Pride & Anger

(HALT - Hungry, Angry, Lonely & Tired)

<u>Genesis 4:5b</u> "So Cain was very <u>angry</u>, and his face was downcast. Then the LORD said to Cain, 'Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right, will you not be accepted?"

God invites Cain into awareness.

<u>Proverbs 16:18</u> (MSG) "First pride, then the crash—the bigger the ego, the harder the fall."

Ephesians 4:26-27 "In your anger do not sin, do not let the sun go down while you are still angry; and do not give the devil a foothold."

Choose a posture of Humility over Pride, as quickly as possible.

Look at Eve and her Seed, who becomes the Seed of the Serpent.

Eve's Pride:

Genesis 4:1 (MSG) "Adam slept with Eve his wife. She conceived and had Cain. She said, 'I've gotten a man..."

Genesis 4:25 (MSG) "Adam slept with his wife again. She had a son whom she named Seth. She said, 'God has given me another child in place of Abel whom Cain killed."

"Gotten" in Hebrew is "ganah" and means to get, acquire or create.

Genesis 14:22 "With raised hand I have sworn an oath to the LORD, God Most High Creator, (Qanah) of heaven and earth..."

Eve, in verse 1 is in a posture of pride – "Look at what I have done... created (Qanah) a man." But, by the end of the narrative/story, she says, "Look at what the LORD has done...given me another child."

Notice Eve's shift from pride to humility

Cain's Pride:

Cain, in contrast, cannot escape his posture of pride even after God invites him into awareness & a better choice (He doesn't listen to correction) & kills his brother Abel.

Genesis 4:7 "If you do what is right, will you not be accepted?"

<u>1 John 3:12</u> (MSG) "We must not be like Cain, who joined the Evil One (Seed of the Serpent) and then killed his brother (Abel)."

Lamech's Pride:

Genesis 4:23-24 "Lamech said to his wives, 'Adah and Zillah, listen to me; wives of Lamech, hear my words. I have killed a man for wounding me, a young man for injuring me. If Cain is avenged seven times, then Lamech seventy-seven times."

• Lamech's pride is over the top - presuming to be like God

Ephesians 4:26-27 "In your anger do not sin, do not let the sun go down while you are still angry; and do not give the devil a foothold."

<u>James 1:19-20</u> "Be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires."

- Awareness of our vulnerability toward pride and anger can empower us to defeat sin.
- 2. Broken by doing what is Good & Right (Obedience)

Genesis 4:6-7 "Then the LORD said to Cain, 'Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right (tov) will you not be accepted?"

Psalms 25:9 (ESV) "He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way."

Galatians 6:10 "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people..."

1 Thessalonians 5:15 "See that no one repays anyone evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to everyone."

Romans 12:21 "Do not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good."

"The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for **good** men to **do** nothing." – Edmund Burke.

Awareness of our need for good (Tov) choices, (discerning Good from Bad
 Evil) can empower us to defeat sin.

Hebrews 10:24-25 "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

- Awareness of our need for, and participation in community is critical to defeat sin.
- 3. Close, at the Door (Don't Open the Door)

Genesis 4:7 "But if you do not do what is right (tov), sin is crouching (lying) at your door..."

• "At the door" indicates proximity and vulnerability.

Hebrews 12:1 "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles."

- Where there is accessibility there is vulnerability.
- What's the point? If the door is open to sin, close it. If the door is closed, lock it.

4. Driven by Deceptive Desires

Genesis 4:7b "Sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it."

This links back to Genesis 1:28 "Rule over" & 3:6 "Desirable for gaining wisdom."

Walking with God; staying in sync with God, is where we learn to rule over (Manage) our desires instead of our desires managing (ruling over) us.

<u>Jeremiah 17:9</u> (NIV84) "The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? 'I the LORD search the heart and examine the mind, to reward a person according to what he has done, according to what his deeds deserve."

<u>James 1:14</u> "Each one is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evilopsires and enticed."

Ephesians 4:22-23 "You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds..."

- Awareness of our deceitful desires brings caution instead of compulsion; we recognize the need to pause to purify our desires instead of pursuing our desire just because we have them.
- II. Three things to practice/do (Our Part) to gain Awareness & Defeat Sin

Ask God to:

1. Search Your Heart - Cultivating the Condition of our Heart (your desires)

<u>Psalms 123:23-24</u> (NIV 84) "<u>Search me,</u> O God, and know my <u>heart</u>; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me the way everlasting."

2. Forgive Your Sin - Purifying the Content our heart (aberrant desires)

1 John 1:8-9 "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

3. Accept Your Offering - Maintaining the Commitment of our Heart (Pure desires)

Romans 12:1-2 (MSG) "So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."
